Welcome from Carol Hill

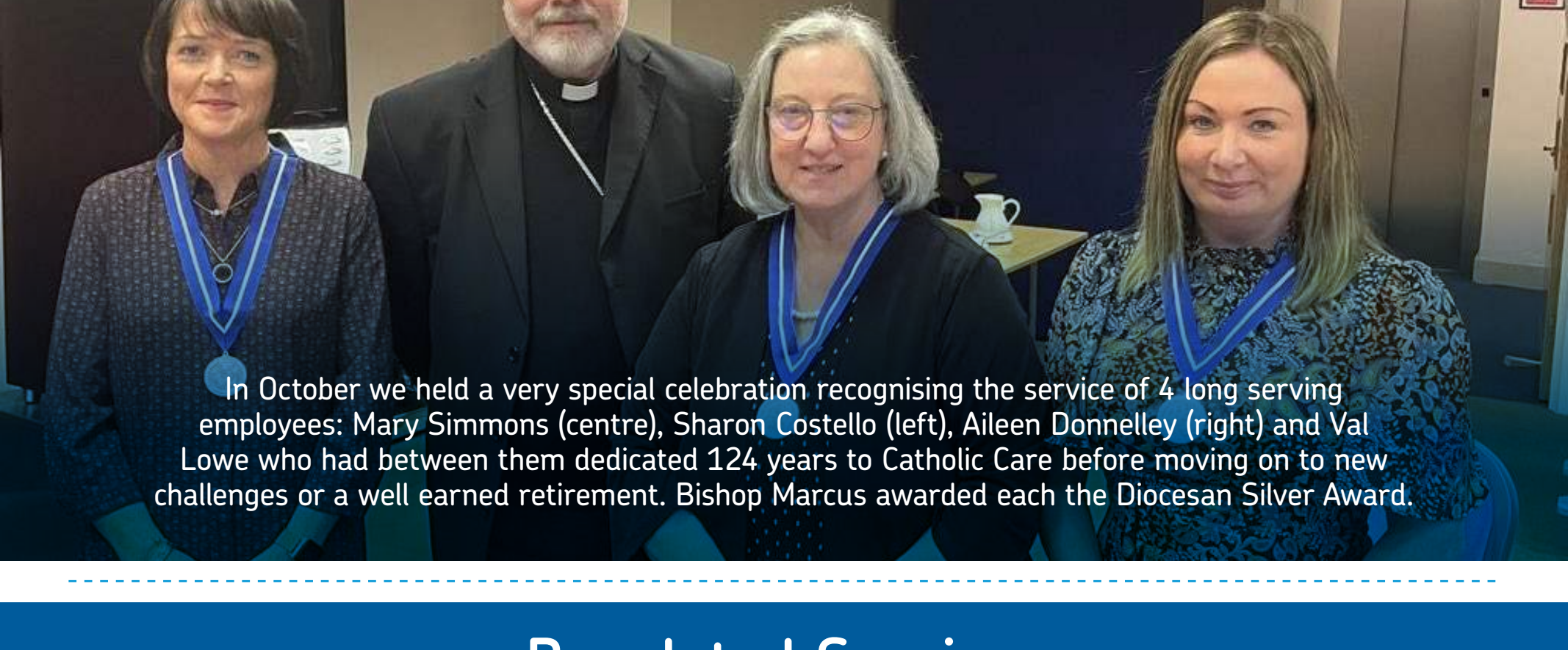
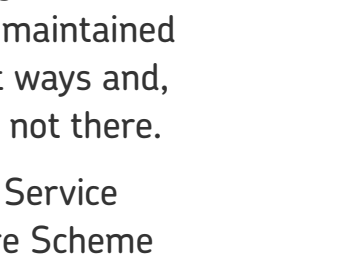
2021 has proved to be another very challenging year dominated by the COVID-19 pandemic with the year starting in lockdown and ending with the Omicron variant.

Vaccinations certainly played a key part in the fight against the virus during the year with the first and second doses being administered during the first half of the year and the booster in the autumn. Through lots of encouragement and explanation the Charity achieved 99% of staff across the whole organisation being fully vaccinated. The biggest challenge faced has been the increase in demand for service in response to increasing levels of need against a backdrop of limited fundraising.

Although it has been a difficult year there has also been much to celebrate. The resilience, loyalty and commitment of the Charity's staff and volunteers has been absolutely amazing and I can't thank them enough. Despite their own personal challenges, they have once again maintained all of the Charity's services, with some having to be delivered in innovative and different ways and, as a result, the Charity has been a constant for those in need when others were simply not there.

The Charity has opened new services during the year in its Adult Learning Disability Service and excitingly, for the first time, is providing care to 66 people who live in an Extra Care Scheme for Older People in Skipton.

The past 2 years have demonstrated the resilience, forward thinking and vibrancy of the Charity as it emerges from the pandemic.



In October we held a very special celebration recognising the service of 4 long serving employees: Mary Simmons (centre), Sharon Costello (left), Aileen Donnelly (right) and Val Lowe who had between them dedicated 124 years to Catholic Care before moving on to new challenges or a well earned retirement. Bishop Marcus awarded each the Diocesan Silver Award.

Historically caring for adults and children in homes and schools has been the mainstay of the Charity.



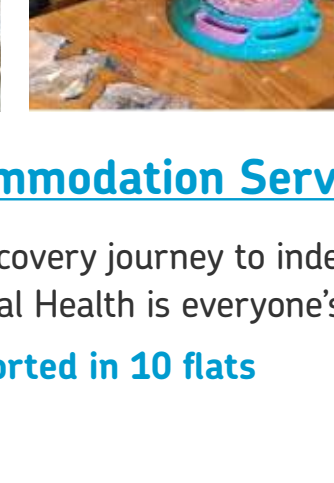
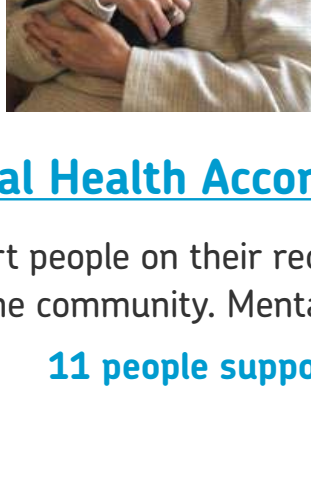
Older People's Services

Eller Beck Court – Extra Care

New Service - For the first time Catholic Care is caring for and supporting older people in an accommodation setting. Working in partnership with H21, Eller Beck Court opened in September 2021, welcoming its first residents in the October. The Charity provides the care and support to the people living in the Extra Care Apartments helping them to maintain their independence.

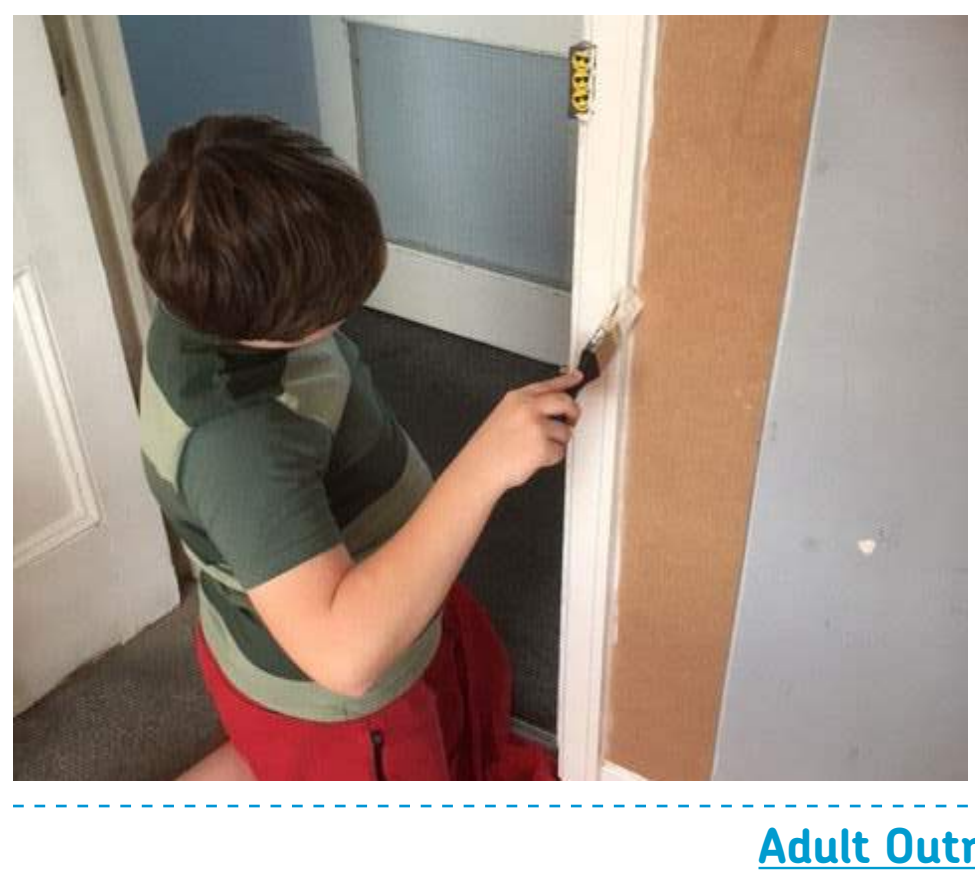

Children's Residential Care

Our Leeds residential home provides care for up to 7 teenage males, making a positive difference to their lives and preparing them for life after care. During lockdown the young people helped to decorate the home.

Adult Outreach Service

Our Service provides care and support in a person's own home, promoting and maintaining their independence. We continue to provide a service to the retired clergy in the Diocese who are frail or in need of personal support.

Support for Asylum Seekers and Refugees

Much of our direct work is through the Gianna Project. Working in partnership with St Monica's Housing, the Charity has a home for 4 destitute asylum seeking women in Leeds.

Catholic Care is a Lead Sponsor with the Home Office for the Community Sponsorship Scheme for refugees.

Despite the impact of COVID, 3 new groups have formed during the year and have submitted their applications for approval. The group from the Parish of St John the Baptist in Normanton welcomed a Syrian family in January 2022.

The first family supported through the Community Sponsorship Scheme in Settle arrived 2 years since their arrival in August.
